Welcome to the Student Enterprise Programme 2018-2019

Local Enterprise Office South Dublin is delighted to welcome you to another exciting year of youthful enterprise and innovation.

This year in South Dublin, over 700 students from schools around the county competed for a place at the County Final. 56 enterprise **projects** were shortlisted representing **180 student entrepreneurs** across the 3 categories. These finalists showcased their enterprising acumen at the County Final proving that youth entrepreneurship is alive and well in our county. A total of 27 awards worth close to €4000 were presented to exceptional projects in the areas of publishing, sport, technology, beauty, crafts, textiles and fitness.

Junior, Intermediate and Senior County Award winners from Coláiste Éanna and Colaiste Chillian and Coláiste Éanna

respectively did their schools and county proud at national level. Deadly Dublin Days, CC Hoodies and Relumination, all had a fantastic experience at the National Finals, and were unlucky not to bring home any awards. Fingers crossed for 2018/2019!

Phase 1: September / October - Introduction to SEP & Innovation Workshop:

Introduction to the programme and how to generate innovative business ideas and projects. Assists students use a variety of techniques to identify and select the best ideas.

Phase 2: October / November - Developing your Business Idea:

Developing your business idea by means of research, protection and product development. Assists students analyse and develop their idea into viable projects. Workshops must be booked in advance. - Complete the Student workbook at you progress and keep all materials in a file/folder for ease of access
- To make the best possible business report, give yourself plenty of time to create it, and try to have your first draft completed by the end of January 2019
