EXPORT TO LIVERPOOL PROGRAMME

5 Local Enterprise Office client businesses took part in a trade development programme which supported them to win new customers in the Merseyside region.



COUNTY CARLOW WEB AWARDS

Huge level of entries for the first ever County Carlow Web Awards which acknowledged and promoted SMEs based in County Carlow who had developed their digital and web marketing platforms as part of their product offering. The B!q Idea House won the overall prize.



Over 100 businesses took part in a specialist seminar on introducing digitalisation to business processes as part of our delivery of the new 'Digital Start' programme.



POWERHOUSE - WOMEN IN BUSINESS NETWORK

The first Powerhouse Picnic was held in June with Lucy Kennedy as MC and over 160 businesswomen in attendance. The year ended with the first Powerhouse Awards for businesswomen in County Carlow. There were 24 finalists shortlisted with the 9 category winners sharing €5,000 worth of investment in their business development.

LAUNCH OF INCARLOW ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & BUSINESS SUPPORT STRATEGY

Carlow County Council published the inCarlow Economic Development & Business Support Strategy 2022-2027 which demonstrates how agencies and industry can collectively develop County Carlow's economy, through an extensive programme of activities intended to stimulate and support local growth.

INTERNATIONAL LEARNINGS!

The Local Enterprise Office brought 10 representatives of the Carlow engineering sector to the Mach convention in Birmingham in April and 9 representatives of the food and drinks sector in Co. Carlow on a trade educational visit to a series of 6 major trade exhibitions in the Excel Arena, London in October.



CRAFT HUB

Carlow hosted two residencies which saw crafters from all around Europe attend to network with their Carlow counterparts and develop their skillsets through collaboration.
