CARLON A vision for a living town centre

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Nicholas De Jong, Urban Design were invited to prepare a new overall design plan for the rejuvenation of Carlow Town Centre. The brief for the project included examining the functioning of the Town Centre, key linkages including links to Fairgreen, creation of a new civic plaza and the creation a new palette of street furniture and materials that would be used throughout the Town.

The plan is prepared recognising that Town Centres and the way that people use them have changed. The creation of a new reimagined vision for Town Centre space is designed so the Town Centre becomes a destination that people have a desire to visit, live and work in. Increased activity in the Town will help vibrancy, retail and social life which will help sustain Carlow for a new generation.














The design concept for the enhancement of the public realm is to ensure that the materials selected compliment the existing built environment. The palettes chosen are chosen for 3 distinct areas within the Town Centre: - Tullow Street and Dublin Street are traditional Town centre streets with many fine examples of building retained from Carlow's history. The choice of paving slab along these streets will restore the footpath to the traditional look of the street and place the emphasis back on the architecture of the buildings. To compliment this street furniture will have features associated with an older Town Centre such as lanterns type lighting.

Barrack Street and Kennedy Avenue are much wider streets that have a mix of older and contemporary building. The width of the street lends itself to much larger paving slabs and larger pieces of street furniture with opportunities for the addition of green features such as grass margins and trees. Street light will be much taller to allow for the wider streets and with contemporary design to reflect the newer building on the streets.

Potato Market's design is to inspire a feeling of a larger open civic heart of the Town. The paving is longer and narrow to give a sense of depth to the space. The desired outcome in the area is to have a space where people can congregate, enjoy some safe outdoor space and where markets and festivals can locate. The space will contain seating, contemporary lighting, trees and water features to provide a lively civic space.

The Town Centre Link has potential to link the traditional Town Centre with the Fairgreen development through a new pedestrian street passing through the heart of Carlow Shopping Centre. The link has the potential to draw these two areas together and open up valuable back land areas of Carlow. The proposed link will be a paved area feeding directly into the new civic plaza.


A. TULLOW STREET (UPPER)

PUBLIC REALM PROPOSALS

- Improvements to junction with Barrack Street, including increased provision for pedestrians and cyclists.
- Traffic circulation changed to one-way westbound from the service road.
- Two-way traffic retained from service road to Barrack Street junction.
 Widened footpaths throughout.
- Street trees on the approach to Barrack Street junction to reinforce the gateway character of the street.
- 6. Linear short-stay parking and loading bays where road width is sufficient.7. Raised table/shared surface outside the Library / Museum and at junction with
- Potato Market.

 8. Improved surface finishes and street lighting throughout.
- 9. Potential redevelopment of Opportunity Site 5 for residential infill (town houses) with
- pedestrian links to the Cathedral and Carlow College / Visual (refer to Key Plan board).
- Lower Tullow Street improvements to include repairs to existing surfaces and de-cluttering.


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TULLOW STREET UPPER ILLUSTRATIVE VIEW AS PROPOSED OUTSIDE THE LIBRARY / MUSEUM

B. KENNEDY AVENUE

PUBLIC REALM PROPOSALS

- Improvements to junction with Barrack Street, including change to traffic signal control, increased provision for pedestrians and cyclists, and realignment of road to proposed bus park entrance.
- Widened footway on north side by Shopping Centre to promote more active retail frontages.
- Removal of vehicle service lane from north side and relocation of taxi rank on-street.
 Removal of existing roundabout by 'Tree of Life' sculpture and changed vehicle access

to multi-storey car park (controlled service access retained) to create new civic plaza.

6. Provision of continuous cycle lanes both sides of Avenue.
7. Raised table with major pedestrian crossing to increase connectivity between future Penney's development and the town centre.





C. TOWN CENTRE LINK



PUBLIC REALM PROPOSALS

- Vehicular access to Fairgreen Shopping Centre relocated from Barrack Street to Bridge Street (with provision for occasional access if necessary).
- Traffic calming and raised table to increase pedestrian connectivity across Barrack Street.
 Creation of pedestrian route through existing Penney's service yard, connecting Barrack
- Street to the Potato Market.
 Replacement of the 11 derelict properties with 3-storey building (e.g. for student accommodation or similar) providing an improved streetscape to Barrack Street and over-looking of the new pedestrian route.
- Potential partial redevelopment of Carpenter's site to provide new commercial / residential uses and active frontages to the proposed route and the existing service road.
- Service access to Penney's and vehicle access to car park via service road from Tullow Street.
- Potential small-scale infill units (e.g. for speciality retail and / or catering / business start-ups) to ground floor of car park to help enliven the route.
- Lightweight canopy structure to reinforce the presence of the new spine route from Barrack Street.



PUBLIC REALM PROPOSALS

- Junction improvements at each end of the street, with increased provision for pedestrians and cyclists.
- Potential for redevelopment of derelict buildings (Opportunity Site 6) to create new pedestrian link and to strengthen streetscape - see Town Centre Link board.
- Traffic calming and raised table / pedestrian crossing at current entrance to Fairgreen Shopping Centre, and including feature canopy structure to signify the proposed new
- Provision for occasional vehicle access / egress to Fairgreen Shopping Centre (bollard controlled).
- 5. Widened pedestrian areas.
- 6. Existing vehicle access to properties on eastern side retained.7. Improved 'boulevard-type' street lighting and new street trees
- to supplement existing where required.
- 8. Improved surface finishes throughout.
