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Who are We

Small businesses are the heart of the Irish economy. Tasked with enterprise development and job creation, the Local Enterprise Office Network is the most important resource for small businesses in Ireland. Located in Carlow County Council, the Local Enterprise Office Carlow is the first stop shop for those looking to plan, start or grow their business.

In April 2014 the existing 35 County Enterprise Boards were dissolved and 31 Local Enterprise Offices were established within the Local Authority structure. The Department of Jobs, Enterprise and Innovation (DJEI) now The Department of Enterprise Trade and Employment (DETE) re-structured the delivery of supports for microenterprise to enhance the national enterprise support model for small and micro businesses. This adjustment resulted in a coordinated and cohesive approach to the development of micro-enterprise in Ireland and has the potential to contribute significantly to future economic growth and job creation across the regions. The LEO model ensures that micro-enterprise and small business service delivery continues with significant **local input, within a national micro-enterprise policy framework.**



On a daily basis, **LEO Carlow** provides the right supports at the right time to new and existing small businesses, including:

- financial assistance and access to microfinance loans
- training and development
- mentoring and advice
- signposting to relevant bodies and agencies
- networking opportunities



Enterprise Ireland

A Framework Service Level Agreement (SLA) sets the context for the operation of the LEOs by the Local Authorities, on behalf of Enterprise Ireland (EI). Under this SLA, EI plays a significant oversight role in the activities of the LEOs and, through its Centre of Excellence (CoE), ensures the appropriate matching and linking of national policy and programmes with local policies and programmes.

The Local Enterprise Office (LEO) Carlow is the 'first stop shop' for anyone thinking about starting or growing a business in Carlow. This report looks back at the impact LEO Carlow has had in the enterprise ecosystem from 2014 to 2021.One of the fundamental principles behind the design and operation of the LEOs is that they are uniquely placed to be both key stakeholders in the national enterprise strategy to create jobs in Ireland and at the same time remain closely connected to the local enterprise ecosystem. LEO Carlow engages with its diverse range of businesses every day to deliver valuable supports and actively stays connected so that it can innovate to meet the ever-changing needs of its clients.

LEO Carlow works closely with the other LEOs in the region - Kilkenny, Wexford, Waterford & Tipperary in partnership with the Ireland South East Development Office. Examples of Regional Projects have included the Regional Agri-Food Project, South East Remote Working Study, Start Up & Scale Up Programmes and Green for Micro Scheme.

LEO Carlow as part of its wider in Economic Development & Special Project Development has ensured that Carlow County Council has actively responded to funding opportunities for County Carlow in the form of National and International Funding. Covid-19 has undoubtedly forced the world to adjust, adapt, and pivot. The LEO reworked how it delivered key services almost



overnight and shifted training programmes and mentoring supports online. New training events, like online Lunch & Learn sessions and Covidspecific training courses, were created to support businesses through the pandemic.

During 2022 we will launch the inCarlow Economic Development & Business Support Strategy for 2022-2027 which will present a future framework for the development of economic opportunities for the County. We have the vision and drive to continue to deliver for our business community through a variety of key projects and supports working in partnership with our key stakeholders at local, national and international level.

I am confident that LEO Carlow will continue to support ambitious entrepreneurs in our communities in County Carlow to plan, start and grow their businesses in 2022 and beyond.

Financial Assistance

Local Enterprise Office Carlow provides a range of grant assistance to eligible businesses. These are designed to help fund start-up costs, expansion plans and jobs growth.

Feasibility grants are designed to assist with researching market demand for a product or service and examining its sustainability.

The **Business Expansion grant** is designed to assist the business in its growth phase after the initial 18 month start-up period.

The Evaluation and Approvals Committee is the volunteer committee that meets to review and approve grant funding. The committee is made up by several members including: a Chair (Director of Service delegated by the Chief Executive of Carlow County Council); an Enterprise Ireland representative; and individuals with specific areas of business expertise. The LEO recognises the significant commitment the committee makes to supporting the work of the office and Carlow's entrepreneurs.

Progression Pathway to Enterprise Ireland

Local Enterprise Office Carlow works with small companies looking to export or trade internationally, helping them to grow to a point where they can avail of Enterprise Ireland supports.



Financial Assistance

The Local Enterprise Office supports businesses as they investigate expanding to new markets to grow the business.

The Technical Assistance for Micro Exporters' grant part-funds the costs of investigating and researching export markets such as exhibiting at trade fairs, preparing marketing material, and developing websites specifically targeting overseas markets.

Microfinance Ireland

Microfinance Ireland (MFI) is a not-for-profit lender established to deliver the Government's Microenterprise Loan Fund. It provides loans of between $\pounds 2,000$ and $\pounds 25,000$ to commercially viable businesses that employ fewer than 10 people, with an annual turnover of less than $\pounds 2$ million.

Local Enterprise Offices assist client companies with their MFI loan applications, which attract a discount on standard loan rates.





Training & Development

Over 12,300 participants have attended training programmes offered by Local Enterprise Office Carlow between 2014 - 2021. The LEO offers a diverse range of training programmes aimed at micro / small business and entrepreneurs looking to acquire new skills or develop existing ones. The aim is to enable and equip participants to start or grow their own businesses.

Every year the Local Enterprise Office invests over £100,000 in a suite of Start Up & Development Programmes which are provided to the business community in a

low to no cost way.

In 2021 Carlow County Council's Local Enterprise Office published an extensive training needs analysis. This research-based needs analysis was developed to guide the delivery of training and business development programmes to the business community in County Carlow and was the result of a consultation with over 200 Carlow businesses.

The LEO's core programme for those starting to consider establishing a business is the **Start Your Own Business Programme**. The office runs several programmes throughout the year. Over 650 participants have enjoyed the benefits of this programme in Carlow since 2014, leading to the establishment of many innovative local businesses.

The Management Development Programme

is the Local Enterprise Office's flagship support programme for the owner / managers of established Carlow businesses who want to approach the growth of their businesses with a new strategic focus. Every year dozens of Carlow business owner / managers take part in this transformative programme.





Training & Development

The Food Academy is a training programme aimed at supporting and nurturing start-up food businesses. The Local Enterprise Offices have joined forces with Bord Bia and SuperValu on this initiative to provide a consistent level of food marketing knowledge to new and early-stage food business owners. At the final workshop, participants get the opportunity to present their product to a panel from SuperValu and if successful, can participate in a trial based in local shops, which in the right circumstances, could progress over time to a national listing with SuperValu.

Unison Business Development Series is a

programme of short, tailored, half day business programmes delivered by the Local Enterprise Office throughout the year. Topics cover a broad range of subjects relevant to local businesses from technology to marketing to finance. The training needs analysis published by the Local Enterprise Office showed a demand from local businesses for bite-sized programmes which could serve as a lead-in to more comprehensive supports. The popular Unison series was developed in response to this demand.

The Profit Academy is a financial development programme which supports the owners and key staff of Carlow businesses to appreciate the financial factors which impact their growth and profitability. The Profit Academy, which is unique to County Carlow, gives companies the opportunity to develop their in-house capacity and build an understanding of their financial health which will help them to grow and develop.

Local Enterprise Week

This high-profile annual initiative showcases the full range of enterprise supports LEOs can offer existing and aspiring entrepreneurs. A week-long programme of mentoring, advice and networking shines a spotlight on the services and supports available to SMEs and start-ups, as well as providing a selection of events and workshops, tailored to inspire and inform. Local Enterprise Week offers a wealth of opportunity to learn, share, inform and contribute to the thriving start-up and micro enterprise community in Carlow.

National Enterprise Awards

31 companies are shortlisted by the LEOs for the National Enterprise Awards every year. The series of country-wide competitions culminates in the national final which takes place in Dublin's Mansion House. 12 winning companies across a range of categories share a €40,000 prize fund to further support their business to grow and scale.

Enterprise Awards & Promotion

National Women's Enterprise Day

This Local Enterprise Office initiative is an annual event designed to celebrate women in business. Events in the programme are free of charge and include workshops, panel discussions, facilitated networking to connect more entrepreneurs with each other and advice and insights from some of Ireland's most successful female entrepreneurs.

Local Enterprise Village

31 small businesses are supported by their Local Enterprise Office each year to exhibit their products and services at the Local Enterprise Village at the National Ploughing Championships.

Local Enterprise Office Carlow hosted the Local Enterprise Village in 2019 at the site of the National Ploughing Championships in Fenagh when a **record 297,000 visitors** attended "the ploughing" over its **3 days**.

Showcase Ireland

Showcase Ireland is a trade show for the crafts and design sector held annually in the RDS in Dublin. It is an event which attracts over 2,700 trade buyers over its 4 days. Showcase is one of the biggest trade shows of the year with buyers attending from around the world.

A select number of companies from each LEO are supported with a stand in the Enterprise Zone of Showcase Ireland in January every year. Local Enterprise Office Carlow has always been extremely active in supporting our clients to exhibit at Showcase and to prepare for the opportunity to present their products in front of some of the industry's most influential buyers. Carlow clients who have exhibited in the Enterprise Zone include Ballyshane Irish Wood Design, Jo Browne Natural Solid Perfumes and Sidereus Watches.









Networking

Local Enterprise Office networks are key to provide an opportunity for entrepreneurs to come together and support each other as they grow and develop their businesses.

Taste inCarlow is an innovative marketing and networking platform representing many of the outstanding food and drink producers and providers based in Carlow. The group aims to raise awareness of the quality of food and drink associated with Carlow and to provide an opportunity for businesses working in that sector to explore options for collaboration.





POWERHOUSE Women in Business

Network is a Local Enterprise Office Carlow initiative for women running their own business. Being an entrepreneur can be challenging and the group provides opportunities to share experiences, learn from other women and expand the business network.



The Enterprise Europe Network helps business grow through tailored support, new business and technology partnerships, commercial opportunities, licensing deals, and partner searches for EU funded R&D. Services are tailored to SMEs but are also available to all other businesses, universities and research centres.

Networking

FORM Designmade in Carlow is a group of designer makers and craftspeople living and working Carlow.

Collectively FORM's aims are to:

- Raise the profile of designer makers and craftspeople producing high quality work in Co. Carlow
- Promote Carlow as a destination for high quality design and craft
- Provide a forum for the exchange of views, common objectives, collective activities, constructive criticism and feedback amongst highly skilled designer makers and craftspeople



FORM was established by Carlow County Council's Local Enterprise Office and continues to be funded by the LEO. FORM's activities have included a Christmas pop-up shop in Fairgreen Shopping Centre.

The Business Picnic is an annual event which takes place in Carlow in the summer and is one of Ireland's most innovative networking events. The event is hosted by Carlow County Council's Local Enterprise Office and attracts businesses from across the country.

The Business Picnic is a free event designed to encourage professional connections in an informal setting. Open to businesses all over Ireland, the Picnic aims to encourage future business development, not just in Carlow, but nationally.

Trade Mission to Netherlands

Carlow County Council's Local Enterprise Office organised a networking and trade mission to the Netherlands for Carlow businesses in 2019 as part of our wide programme of supports to encourage the diversification of marketplaces as a response to Brexit. 7 representatives of Carlow businesses travelled on the trade mission and they held 28 pre-arranged meetings with prospective Dutch costumers over a 3 day period. **County Carlow Chamber** is the representative body for businesses in the county. Carlow County Council's Local Enterprise Office supports the chamber to deliver a range of networking activities throughout the year.





Trading Online Vouchers

The Trading Online Voucher Scheme (TOV)

is designed to get small firms trading online, opening up markets at home and abroad. The initiative involves training, advice, and financial assistance. Designed under the National Digital Strategy to assist small businesses to increase their online trade, the scheme is funded by the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications, and delivered by Local Enterprise Offices. A total of 325 vouchers were approved to Carlow businesses between 2014 - 2021 to the value of €698,627. Of this amount 161 vouchers collectively worth €366,615 were approved in 2020 to Carlow businesses who wanted to develop new customer bases in response to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Green & Lean



Lean and Green Projects are about looking at new or innovative ways to do things within your business. But also looking at your business in a new or innovative way. This can help with the future of a business to reduce costs, remain competitive, be more sustainable and, ultimately, provide a better product or service to customers.

Optimization+

Minimising food waste is one of the easiest financial savings a food business can make. Food producers, pubs, cafés and restaurants can all adopt simple techniques which will have an immediate impact on their profitability and sustainability.

Local Enterprise Office Carlow developed the **Optimization+ Programme** to help Carlow businesses reduce waste and save money. Food and drinks producers and providers were supported to measure the cost of food waste to their business using the Touchstone tool and then minimise this cost through the use of simple lean and green techniques.

Student Enterprise Programme

Helping to seed the idea of entrepreneurship in secondary schools, the **Student Enterprise Programme** encourages young people to research, establish and run their own businesses, with the help of student enterprise coordinators from the Local Enterprise Office.

Secondary schools in Carlow have always embraced the opportunity to allow their students experience entrepreneurship through the Student Enterprise Programme. Each year up to 11 Carlow schools enter the competition with up to 160 mini-companies being formed to compete within their school and against the rest of the county.













Economic Development & Special Project Development

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Economic Development & Special Projects

The Local Enterprise Office works on a cross functional basis to develop competitive funding and economic development projects which are delivered in-house by the economic development team of the Local Enterprise Office and across the wider corporate body of Carlow County Council.

Since the establishment of the LEO offices and as part of this cross functional work \in 8.4 million of resources have been awarded to Carlow County Council as follows:

The delivery of these projects and actions are delivered on a cross functional basis across the Local Authority.





Carlow Tourism

Carlow Tourism is the marketing and tourism development company for County Carlow whose remit is to increase the number of domestic and overseas holidaymakers to the county and maximise economic benefits vis-à-vis job creation and revenue for the entire county of Carlow. The company aims to provide a cohesive approach to tourism marketing and development planning in co-operation and collaboration with all relevant agencies with a remit for tourism development within County Carlow.

Carlow Tourism was established in 2001 as a partnership between Carlow County Council, agencies and the tourism industry within the county. It was established on the basis that funding for operational costs would be provided by the County Council in the Annual Estimates and paid by way of a grant-in-aid at the commencement of each year, to assist with cash flow and project management. Revenue is also generated by the company from a variety of sources including an annual membership fee, grants from other statutory bodies and agencies and other sources including fundraising, to fulfil the objectives for which the company was established.



As part of its work, Carlow County Council provide part funding for the operation of Carlow Tourism under a Memorandum of Understanding and annual operational plan and also works with the company on a variety of marketing and product development projects under the Town & Village Scheme, EU Funding and other aspects of its work.



The objectives of Carlow Tourism are:

- To carry on the expeditious promotion, development and administration of the tourism product in the whole of the county (Urban and Rural) of Carlow in collaboration with all relevant agencies and bodies with a remit for tourism development in County Carlow;
- To facilitate the creation of additional employment derived and supported by the continued and additional revenue generated from the marketing of Carlow as a tourism destination;
- To harmonise the workings of all tourism interests, groups, individuals and activities who promote Carlow as a quality tourism destination;
- To develop a marketing strategy which aims to generate an awareness of County Carlow as a tourist destination, both in the marketplace and among the people of Carlow;
- To focus on market segments which offer the most potential while also maximising the length of stay and expenditure by tourists and visitors in the Carlow area;
- To identify, develop and promote products which will increase tourist traffic in co-operation with all relevant bodies.





EU Funding & Development

Carlow County Council as part of its Special Project Development brief develops direct EU funding opportunities in relevant areas of development for the County. This work enhances and compliments the resources available locally and nationally via the development of international partnerships which are designed to enhance the County Carlow Eco-System.

Catalyst was a cross-border Ireland Wales pilot project that used the theme of sustainability to drive and inspire innovation within Welsh and Irish businesses from the food and drink and life science sectors, two of the three priority areas of the Ireland Wales programme.

The University of Wales Trinity Saint David was the lead partner and was joined by Carlow County Council, WRAP Cymru, Tipperary County Council and the Institute of Technology Carlow.

The Catalyst project was part funded by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) through the Ireland-Wales Programme. The Ireland-Wales programme plays a vital role in helping to foster partnerships and business links through cross-border projects between the coastal counties of East and South-East Ireland and West Wales.

Carlow County Council is an EU partner in RU:RBAN which is a Good Practice Transfer Network funded under Urbact.

RU:RBAN's Good Practice is the Management model of Urban gardens in Rome to be transferred to newcomer cities that are geographically, historically and socio-culturally distant from each other, to ensure sharing of experiences to enhance the capacities of local governance. Transfer efforts will be ensured on the 3 well known and successful components the good practice is divided into: 1. Capacity building, 2. Inspiring and training people to manage urban gardens (Gardenisers), 3. Governance & Regulations The RU:RBAN project lead partner is in Italy with partners from Split in Croatia, Algeciras in Spain, Alexandroupolis in Greece and Carlow. The project will conclude in 2023. EU Funding & Development

Carlow County Council is lead partner in a Creative Europe Project called Craft Hub. The project is coordinated by the LEO Offices in partners with Arts, Community & Finance.







Craft Hub is a European project co-funded by the Creative Europe Programme focused on Craft in the context of cultural heritage and its continuing relevance in contemporary practice.

The project activities involve investigating and documenting craft skills and processes; their differing application in creative practice across Europe; and questions of cultural specificity & individual motivations of practitioners. This will be addressed through a comprehensive and exciting program to allow the creation of new craft work / experimental investigations into process and material supported by 42 transnational maker residencies, 305 days of outreach work, 1 festival, 7 exhibitions and 2 conferences.

Partners include, APOSTOLINA TSALTAMPAKI KAI SIA EE [Greece], Materahub [Italy], Craft Scotland [UK], Designkolen Kolding (Denmark), Glasmalerei Peters Studios (Germany), Oslo Metropolitan University (Norway), Universidade NOVA de Lisboa (Portugal) & University of Wales Trinity Saint David (UK).

The project has five core development pillars which form the basis of future development work for the County.

- The creation of a stakeholder forum, steering group and subgroups to oversee and assist with Carlow Food and Drink activity
- Support and develop tourism and agri-tourism
- Develop and provide appropriate business development and training supports
- Develop regional partnerships to benefit food and drink businesses
