Carolan Gifts Ltd. t/a HappyNest

The Happynest brand was launched in March 2014, selling online to the Irish and UK market. Following a redundancy in 2012 and having always designed clothing, Designer and Director, Christine Carolan decided to follow her passion and start a business. She began creating her own range of quality baby products, including the Cosynest (a wrap for car seats) and the Cosysleep (a sleeping bag for babies).



Stayhold Ltd.

Stayhold was founded in February 2013 by Michael Culleton (CEO), Alan Harrison (Director of Research and Development) and Ben Millett (Creative Director). Stayhold products offer a simple solution for people carrying goods in their car boot and prevent their items from getting damaged. The company's first product, Stayhold Classic, was launched to the market in May 2013.



National Athlete Development Academy Ltd.

The National Athlete Development Academy (NADA) is a family run business, with owner Martin Kennedy and his wife Mairéad. NADA was set up in 2008 and the company is now based in a 10,000 square foot facility in Ballycoolin, Dublin 11. NADA was the first company of its kind in the sector, having identified that although there were many opportunities for people to access physical training in Ireland none of this was specifically developed for athletes or sports people.
