

ONE OF IRELAND'S FASTEST GROWING TOWNS

Portlaoise is Ireland's 16th largest town and is a vibrant, multi-cultural and economic engine for the Midlands region. Its proximity to Dublin, Limerick and Cork, provide amply opportunities for residents and businesses alike.

Portlaoise is one of the country's fastest growing towns, and has increased in size by nearly 10% in the past five years alone. Compositionally, 54% of the town's residents are aged under 35, with 43% of households having young children; giving Portlaoise a very young demographic profile. Portlaoise's cultural composition is increasingly diverse, with 22.5% of people living there being of non-Irish nationality.

Portlaoise is within 60 minutes drive of Dublin City and Airport, thanks to its direct access to motorway and rail connections. This enables the town to compete and hold its own against closer centres. The local workforce is highly skilled, with over 28% of people having attained a 3rd level qualification, and a further 20%

Indeed, the proximity of educational centres, both the myriad of institutions in Dublin but also nearby Institute of Technology Carlow, provide significant choice for residents and fantastic access to talent for industry. The J17 National Enterprise Park at Togher, Portlaoise is located directly on the M7/M8 Motorway making Portlaoise a key economic location within the Midlands Region; easily accessible to Dublin Airport/Port.

Household incomes in Laois are among the highest in the region, and affordability is more sustainable than in Dublin. Enterprise supports such as the IDA Business & Technology Park attract investment with sizable growth in the Global Business Services, ICT and manufacturing sectors. This has bolstered the town's traditional employment profile (in agri-business, public services and commerce).

Portlaoise's town centre has been earmarked for significant regeneration funding under the National Planning Framework, and will become one of Ireland's first 'Low Carbon Town Centres'. The town has a rich historical and cultural heritage, with plans underway to establish a culutral quarter. The Triogue Blueway, People's Park and Slieve Bloom Mountains all provide excellent amenities and the town has excellent shopping, schools and healthcare provision.

## FUTURE AMBITION

Published by Laois County Council, '2040 and Beyond: A Vision for Portlaoise' is a strategy that re-examines and re-purposes the town centre to improve public spaces, buildings and walkways to the benefit of residents, tourists and businesses alike.

Among the outcomes will be a Low Carbon Town Centre, improved walkability and better connectivity between the town's main retail and heritage areas. Adjusted layouts will see reductions in carbon emissions, re-balanced parking provision, the planting of hundreds of trees and the inclusion of bicycle lanes. The town will become an exemplar where business thrives and the pride of the population is reflected in public spaces.

# ACCESS TO TALENT

Situated within 60 minutes of a vast array of 3rd Level institutions, Portlaoise commands excellent access to talent, both students and an existing high-skilled labour force.

Most graduates within range of the town attain qualifications in STEM subjects (26%), or in Business, Administration or Law (24%).

Institute of Technology Carlow is just 30 minutes away and offers both full, part-time courses in various Science, Engineering, Business and Humanities topics. IT Carlow work closely with local businesses to drive innovation and ensure industry needs are reflected in course content.

# **BUSINESS ACTIVITY** & CLUSTERING

There are over 1,190 active businesses within 5km of Portlaoise, employing nearly 8,410 people each day from the town and the wider region.

21% of these businesses are in less conventional sectors, where emerging business clusters can often be found. These include the Food & Drink as well as the Green Economy, with Glanbia and Greenfield Global respectively being two of the largest companies in the world producing dairy goods and biofuels in Portlaoise for dispatch to the European and global markets. Portlaoise is also home to ICT companies such as SkOUT - a leader in cybersecurity intelligence and protection. Professional services, FinTech and medical R&D, comprise the town's other key industrial sectors and supplement the town's broad commercial and public service base of activity.


