John's company, JH Public Affairs, specialises in providing training and development with specific focus on Community Enterprise Development. He has vast experience working with rural communities and his work on The Kiltimagh Renewal: Best Practice in Community Enterprise was widely acknowledged and captured in a book of the same name.



Sarah Daly, Creative Spark. A true social innovator, Creative Spark acts as a facilitator between challenged communities and the potential of the creative industries. They have established a very special creative enterprise and training centre in Co. Louth. Creative entrepreneurs are encouraged through training, shared facilities (a print studio and ceramics studio) and affordable workspace provision.

Sean O'Reilly, CEO, Leitrim Sculpture Centre, Contemporary Arts Space & Creative **Enterprise Hub.** A 3D printing lab, an international sculpture centre, foundry and a creative enterprise hub – can there be as creative a small town in Ireland? Manorhamilton is a practical example of a town embracing creativity to stimulate a challenged rural economy.





Brian McAuley, Dungannon Enterprise Centre. Creativity in a box – literally! Innovative, low cost, high impact workspace solutions that create phenomenal employment. Brian is CEO of Dungannon Enterprise Centre and manages over 80,000 sq. ft. of workspace which, since establishment, has rented space to over 260 tenants. In 2013, Brian invested in 13 steel cargo cabins and founded The Cube in a 4,000 sq ft empty workspace unit.

Deirdre Mortell, CEO of Social Innovation Fund Ireland. Their mission is to find and back the best social innovations in Ireland and help them to grow. Not only is Deirdre leading Social Innovation Fund Ireland, she especially loves start-ups and has been involved in 7 in the last ten years.

# **Inspiring Creative Entrepreneurs**

Ireland needs more entrepreneurial citizens: creative, confident individuals who innovate to solve problems and convert ideas into value.

#### Panel discussion and Open forum facilitated by Pauline Whlte.

Pauline has been a Policy Analyst with the Western Development Commission since 2003 and wrote the WDC's 2009 report 'Creative West', the first sectoral review of the potential of the creative industries in the West of Ireland. She is currently the Project Co-ordinator for the €2m EU co-funded 'a creative momentum project' led by the WDC with partners in Sweden, Finland, Iceland and Northern Ireland.





**Úna Burke** is a multi-award winning Luxury Leather Accessories Designer and Artist. Using traditional leather-working techniques in her distinctly complex constructions, Úna makes both seasonal fashion collections and figurative art pieces. Originally from County Roscommon, she moved to the UK to study and, since graduation in 2009, has won numerous Art, Craft and Design awards including the 'Future Makers Emerging Maker award' and 'Irish Designer of the Year'. Úna regularly collaborates with other brands to create bespoke pieces. Such projects have been with luxury car manufacturer Lexus, cosmetics company L'Oreal and many projects for film and TV.

**Shane Deasy, Founder of Bitbuzz.** Shane was the founder and MD of an Irish Wi-Fi business called Bitbuzz, which was sold to Virgin Media in December 2014. He is also an investor in a number of Irish tech start-ups and is now the Executive Chairman of frockadvisor, a fashion tech company founded by Sonya Lennon and Brendan Courtney. Shane is also a Non Executive Director of the Social Innovation Fund Ireland.





**Alan Duggan, CEO of Tribal City Interactive.** A veteran of the mobile games industry, Alan is the CEO of Tribal City Interactive, and is part of a new games hub in the Centre of Creative Media and Arts. Alan was CEO and Studio Manager of Nephin Games where he managed development of multiple titles with a team of 19 staff for leading publishers such as Disney, Warner Brothers, and ESPN. Alan holds a Degree in Engineering from the University of Limerick, and also studied at Boston University and MIT.

**Dina Coughlan & Rory McPartland**. Seeing the potential for placements of Irish music in visual media, they established **Tremolo Music Publishing** as a home for artists and composers with a focus on synchronization licensing. Meanwhile, a sister company **Planet of Sound** is focused on Music Supervision, most recently working on the current Failte Ireland campaign and on "The Young Offenders" which gets its cinema release in 2016. Dina and Rory relocated from New York and will share their experience of establishing global creative businesses in the West of Ireland.





**Gillian Buckley, Western Development Commission**. Access to finance makes it all happen. Gillian is the Investment Manager of the WDC Investment Fund, a €32 million evergreen which comprises three sub-funds which will be of interest to communities and other social enterprises developing creative hubs. Their Community Loan Fund provides loan finance on flexible terms. Loans of between €10,000 to €100,000 have supported 50 communities in the Western Region realise their vision. For creative entrepreneurs, Gillian will share details of the Micro-loan Fund and SME Investment Fund.


### Creative Communities Igniting Change is working to achieve 4 big aims:
