

# What is the Cork Schools Enterprise Programme?

The Cork Schools Enterprise Programme is an exciting and rewarding programme that gives second level students in Cork the chance to set up and run their own business while at school. Organised by the County and City Enterprise Boards, the Programme is run in schools throughout Cork City and County.

#### How does the Programme work?

- The Programme is aimed at students from Transition Year up to Leaving Certificate and runs from September until May.
- Students can enter either individually or as part of a team.
- Students set up their own mini-company and run it exactly like a business. From choosing roles within the company e.g. a Managing Director, Financial Director, Marketing Manager to coming up with their own business idea, making the product, managing the books and writing a business report.
- In December students get to exhibit and sell their products at a Christmas Trade Fair.
- Regional finals are held throughout the country in March each year.
- An overall winner is selected to represent their Enterprise Board at the National Finals held in Tullamore in May.

## How The Programme Benefits Your Students

- Encourages your students to think about entrepreneurship and self-employment as a viable career choice.
- Enhances the learning of business and entrepreneurship by combining classroom learning with real life experience.
- Students can win some fantastic prizes including up to 1,500 euro towards the purchase of new school equipment and an overseas education trip worth over €8,000.

#### 11th September 2008:

## **Teacher Briefing Day**

The **Teacher Briefing Day** is a great opportunity to meet with other teachers on the Programme, learn from their experiences as well as an opportunity to participate in a useful training workshop to help you deliver the minicompany programme. This year innovation expert Sadie Wheatley will give a practical workshop complete with classroom resources to fully equip teachers to help their students to come up with innovative and workable business ideas.

#### 23rd October 2008:

#### Director's Day

At the **Director's Day** a panel of local business people will give presentations covering exactly what's involved in each of the key roles in a mini-company – Managing Director, Financial Director, Sales & Marketing Director, Production and Human Resources Directors. The Programme also features two short practical workshops on (1) How to impress the judges during your interview and (b) How To Decorate Your Exhibition Stand.

## 11/12th December 2008: Christmas Trade Fair

The annual Christmas **Trade Fair** gives mini-companies in schools all over Cork the opportunity to exhibit and sell their products in one of Cork's busiest shopping venues.

A team of judges comprising of members of the local business community will visit each stand and carry out a short interview with the students on the day. Prizes are awarded in a number of categories including best display stand, most innovative idea etc.

#### March 2008:

#### Regional Finals

All mini-companies are welcome to go forward to represent their school at the **Regional Finals** which take place in March. Schools from Cork City and County are given the opportunity to participate in this event which will be held as part of the CIT Innovation Day.

An overall winner from each of the four Enterprise
Board areas is selected on the day and go forward to
participate in the National Finals held in Tullamore in May.
