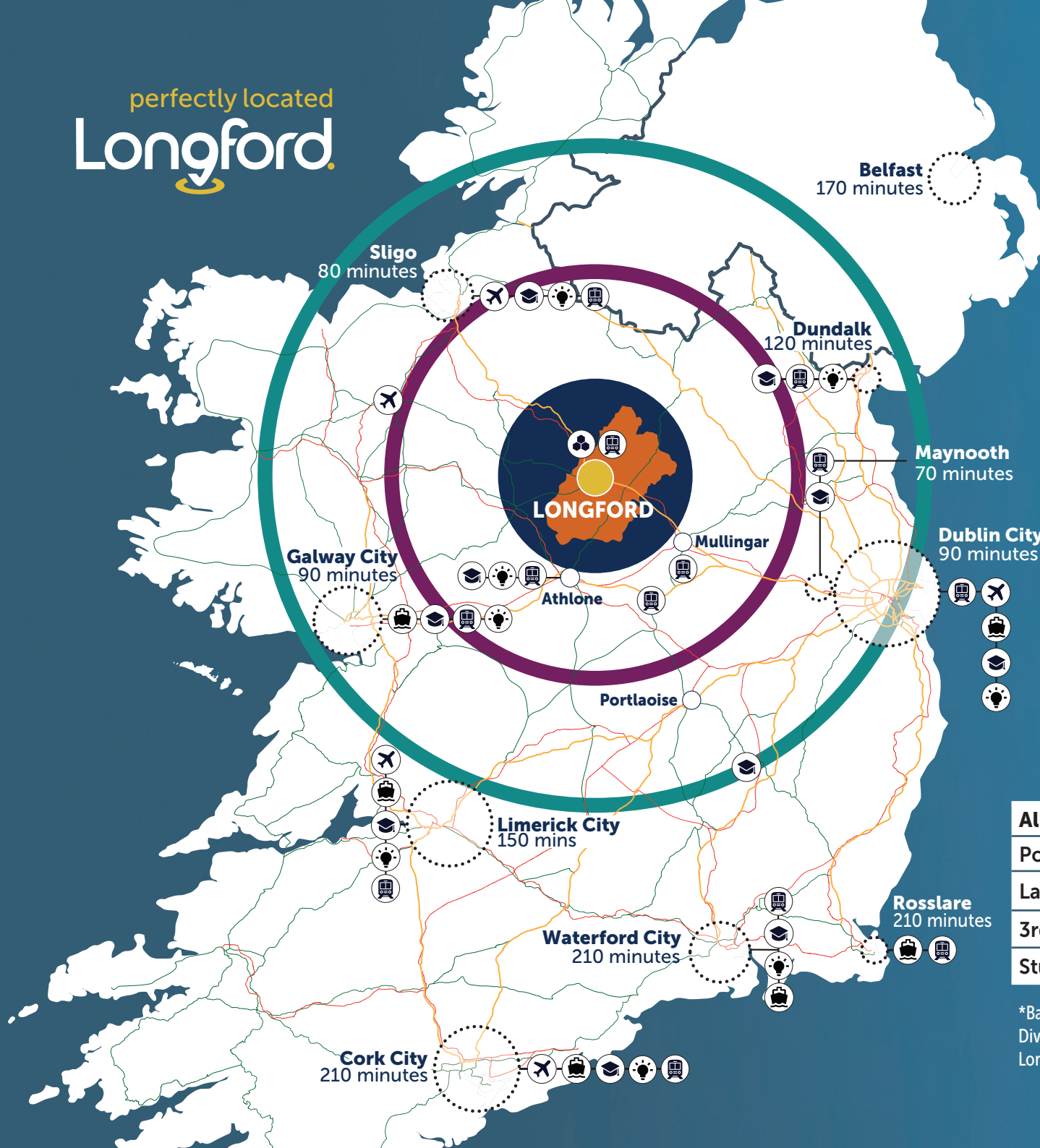

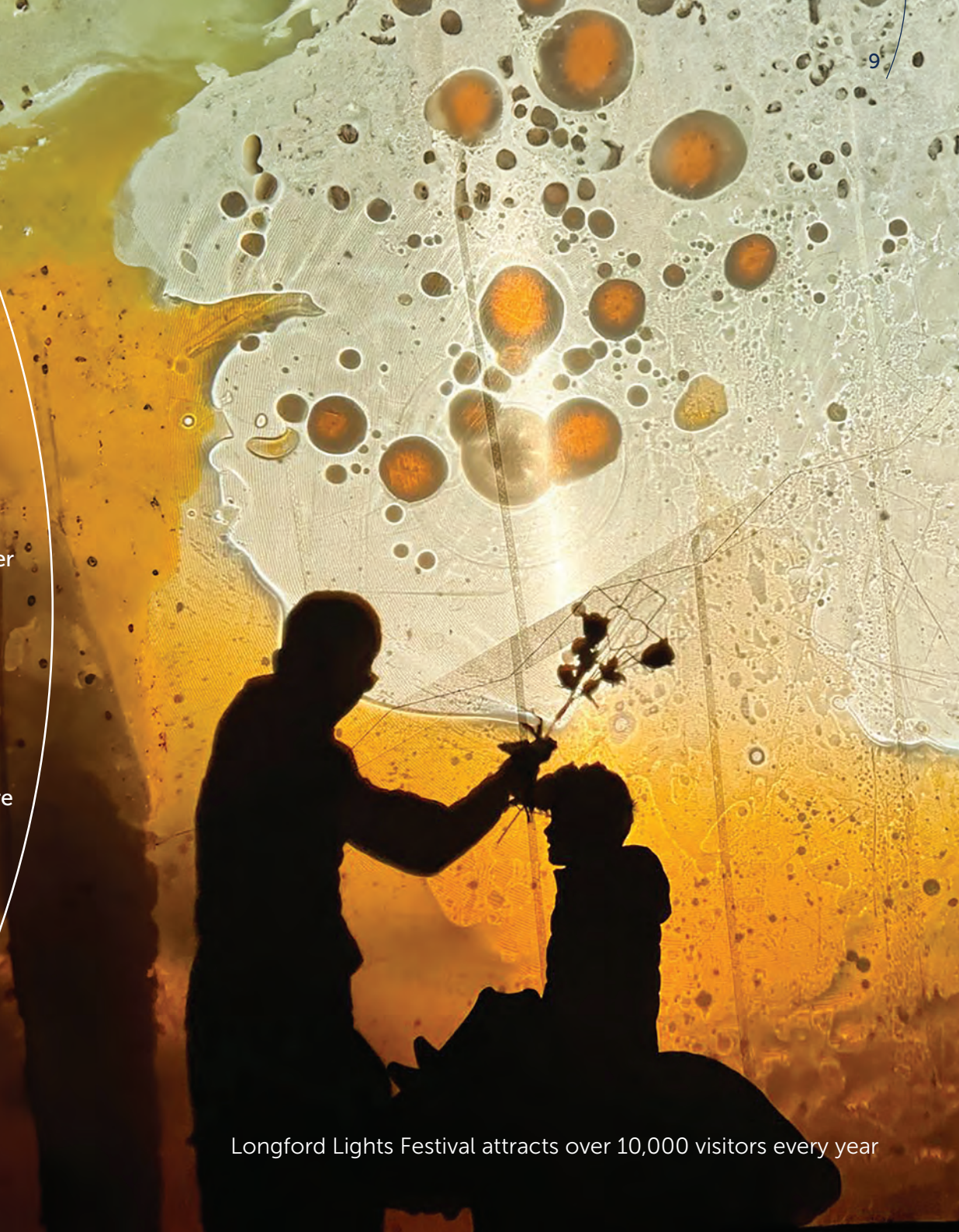
Backstage Theatre (220 capacity) opened its doors in 1995, it was the first arts facility constructed in the county. Longford County hosts several festivals throughout the year to celebrate its heritage. Among them are annual literary festivals celebrating internationally renowned local writers, Padraic Colum, Maria Edgeworth and Oliver Goldsmith.

Longford Arts Service organises several events and celebrations including Culture Night, Longford Lights, and the Dead of Night Festival. Longford's Culture Night spans all aspects of culture from music to film, language to literature and has a depth to ensure there is something for everyone to enjoy.

Core Diagnostics of Abbott is situated on the outskirts of Longford town and manufactures diagnostic reagents and accessories for immunoassay and clinical chemistry applications. The Longford facility plays a key role in helping Abbott to meet the increasing global demand for diagnostic testing in areas such as infectious diseases, cancer, thyroid, and cardiovascular diseases.

Facility construction commenced in 2004 on a green field site. The first manufactured diagnostic reagent kit was distributed in December 2005 with distribution to the US commencing in June 2010.

Diagnostics provide early and accurate detection of medical conditions which can lead to effective treatment for patients. Over the past two decades, Abbott in Longford has remained at the forefront of diagnostic innovation, consistently pushing boundaries to improve patient outcomes. Abbott in Longford manufactures more than 50 diagnostic reagent products. These products detect thyroid function, cardiology, renal and metabolic and fertility and pregnancy function.

Avery Dennison Medical Longford works within the wider Avery Dennison Materials group and draws upon decades of expertise in material science to deliver high-performance products and customised adhesive solutions for medical components that are used daily in medical facilities worldwide.

From its Longford Plant and sister facilities in the US and Belgium, the company produces a range of rolled goods, converted components and finished goods that are used in a variety of applications including Surgical, Ostomy Care, Negative Pressure Wound Therapy, Wound and Skin Care, Diagnostics, Patient monitoring and Medical wearables.

The company offers a complete range of services from adhesive formulation and customization, material selection and design support, sampling and prototyping, to wear studies, biocompatibility assessments, product stability testing, preclinical testing, advanced material characterization, sterilisation and regulatory certification.

Part of what attracted Avery Dennison Medical to acquire Finesse Medical in 2017 was the potential for expansion with the availability of industrial sites and its central location in Longford. Situated in the former IDA Business park on Longford's Ballinalee road at the northeast of Longford town the location offers immediate access to the main N4/N5 route west and east to Dublin port and is also strategically located at the centre of the country which also greatly facilitates our access to support services.

Several warehousing and logistics companies in the area take advantage of this location, providing great logistical support, along with many other service providers and tradespeople offering services from cleaning, facilities management and waste disposal to precision tool fabrication.

The area's food processing and manufacturing history along with many schools means there is a pool of well-trained operational staff to recruit from who are familiar with modern industrial plant operations and the company has also been able to recruit from further afield in Dublin, Galway and Sligo for experienced managerial staff as road and rail links are sufficient to make the plant commutable from these places without the usual traffic congestion.

The industrial support infrastructure of the town is well managed by the Longford County Council and Local Enterprise Office who are always only a phone call or email away and very responsive to any requests or concerns that may be raised from time to time.

Agricultural market - animal feedstuffs



Kiernan Milling is a multi-species animal feed mill supplying products in bulk and bag form throughout the island of Ireland. Our original mill was built in 1979 and is located in Granard, County Longford. Due to increasing demand for our products, we opened a second mill in spring 2020. Our latest investment, brings the combined capacity of both our mills to over 500,000 tons, leaving Kiernan Milling as one of the largest feed mills in Ireland.

Over the last 45 years we have built and maintained a reputation for producing high quality animal feed through constantly innovating our milling processes and investing in the latest milling equipment.

Kiernan Milling has always been committed to sustainable and responsible business practices. Since 2014 we have reduced our carbon footprint by 58%. Our aim is to be the first carbon neutral mill in Ireland by 2027.

Why Longford works for Kiernan Milling

Longford's central location is very attractive to our business as we can easily reach our customers from our base here in Granard. Access to our major shipping ports is just over one hours drive away. Both Dublin and Knock airport is a relatively easy drive from our mill. These upgrades will enable Edgeworthstown to become the leading facility in the EU for the production of own-label pouched pet food and will result in the creation of 100 additional jobs in the local community.

The increased production capacity resulting from this investment will also lead to additional spending with local suppliers and will contribute to the creation of additional indirect employment opportunities downstream, as a result of additional operational spend and the overall economic impact of the investment.

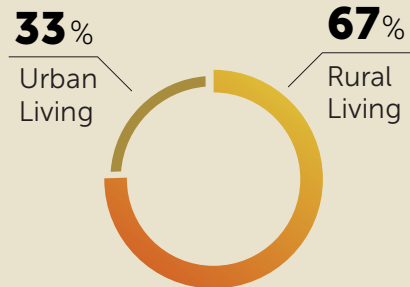



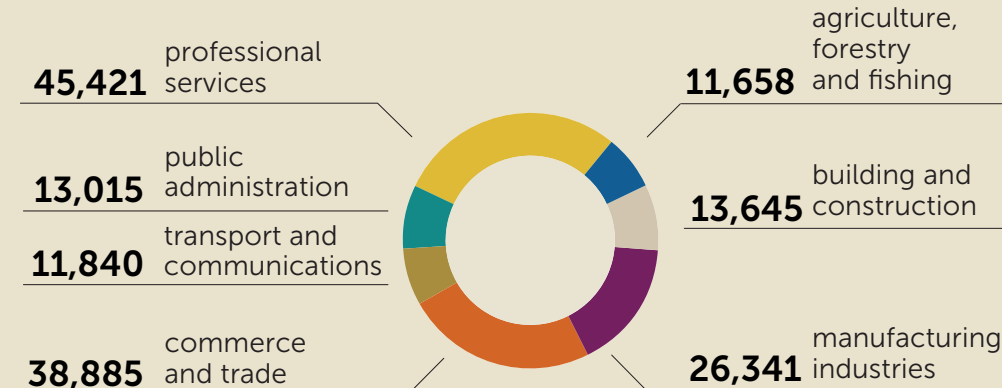

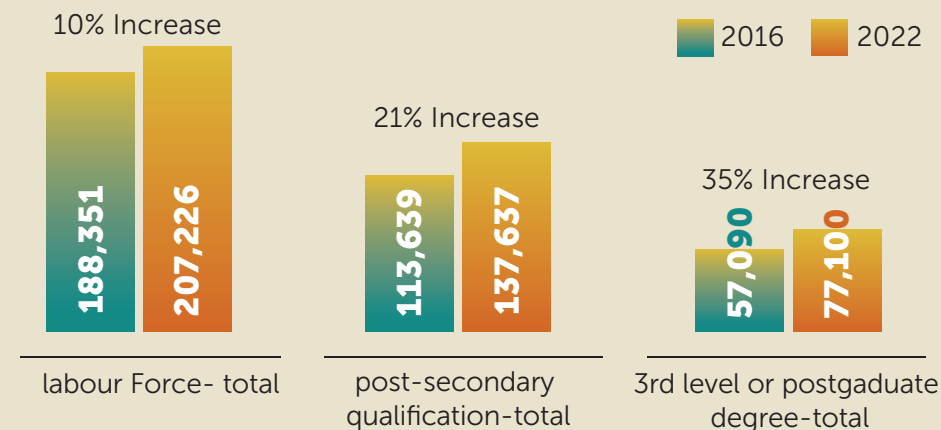
